

**“DON’T SETTLE FOR CHEAP SUBSTITUTES”**

**Ezekiel 14; Deut. 6:4,5; Matt. 22:37; Mk. 12:28-30**

**Big Idea:** God wants our \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, and \_\_\_\_\_

**Ezekiel 14:1-8**

**1. A Condemnation of \_\_\_\_\_ (vs 1-5)**

- 1) There was a problem- they had \_\_\_\_\_ rooted in the \_\_\_\_\_.

**Definition of “Idols of the heart”** = anything or anyone  
that  
begins to capture our \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ and  
\_\_\_\_\_ more than God.  
Idols are anything or anyone more \_\_\_\_\_ to you  
than God.

- 2) Their idols led them into further \_\_\_\_\_

- 3) Their idols \_\_\_\_\_ them from God.

**2. A Call to \_\_\_\_\_ (vs. 6-8)**

True Biblical Repentance involves:

- 1) \_\_\_\_\_ – we acknowledge our sin
- 2) \_\_\_\_\_ – we sorrow over our sin
- 3) \_\_\_\_\_ – we turn away from our sin

Note the example of the Prodigal Son in Luke 15
